Taking full advantage of depth, the Nyssa Bulldogs eked out a narrow 71-66 win over Emmett in a track meet Tuesday, in the first dual meet for both teams for 1969.

With four sophomores leading the way, the Bulldogs grabbed ten firsts to seven for the Huskies.

Emmett's Bob Goodwin pulled down three blues for the Idaho visitors, winning the 120-high hurdles, the 100-yard dash and the long jump.

NHS Sophomores Dellas Frederiksen, Dave Manley, Mike Smith and Bob Edmondson all took top honors for the Bulldogs.

Frederiksen won the pole-vault at 11-8, Manley the two-mile in 10:13 flat, Smith grabbed the mile for Nyssa, with Edmondson capturing the 880-run.

Manley also broke the school record of 4.43 in the mile, with a time of 4.35.7.
