CALL FOR BIDS

THE BOARD OF EDUCATION of the Adrian School District #61, Malheur County, Oregon, will open bids for one (1) new 66 passenger school bus at the Elementary School in Adrian, Oregon, on Tuesday, May 13, 1969, at 8:00 P.M. One (1) 1956 Int. 54 passenger bus to be traded in, this trade in to be used by the District until new bus is delivered.

The bus must equal or exceed the latest state min. standards for school buses. The Board does request some excesses which are listed in specifications. The successful bidder must meet these requirements. The availability of service and repair will be given due consideration in determining the best bid.

The actual bid must be accompanied by the information requested in specifications. These specifications will become a part of the actual bid.

The Board of Directors will accept the best responsible bid but reserves the right to reject any or all bids. If no bid has been accepted within thirty (30) days after the date of bid opening, bidders may withdraw their bid if they desire. The Board requests that bidders refrain from making contacts with individual Board members. Each bidder will be given an opportunity to explain his bid at the bid opening if they so desire.

If bids are mailed to the Clerk, please specify "Bus Bids" on the envelope.

Specifications may be obtained at the office of the High School Superintendent or the School District Clerk, both in Adrian, Oregon.

The purchase of this bus is subject to the approval of the budget by the voters on May 5, 1969.

Upon Question of Increasing Tax Levy Over Amount Limited by Section 11, Article XI, Oregon Constitution.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that an election will be held in School District No. 61 of Malheur County, State of Oregon, from 8:00 a.m. to 8 p.m. on May 5, 1969, at the Adrian Elementary School in said school district, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of said district the question of increasing the tax levy for the fiscal year 1969-1970 over the amount limited by Section 11, Article XI, of the Constitution of Oregon.

The reasons for increasing such levy are: Adrian School District #61 has no tax base. This money is needed to operate the School.

The amount of tax, in excess of the constitutional limitation, proposed to be levied for said fiscal year is \$269,813.50, which, expressed as a rate of levy, is estimated at \$17.90 per thousand dollars of true cash value of taxable property within the district.

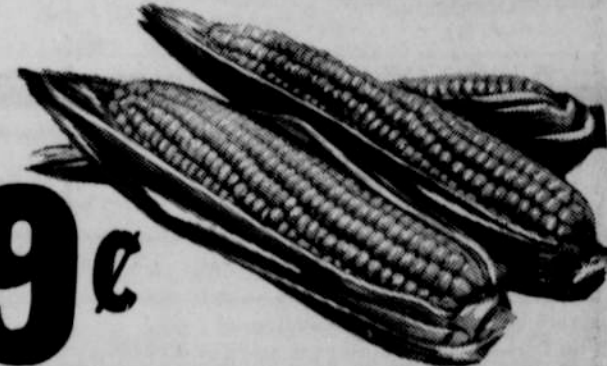
