OREGON TEACHERS STARTING SALARIES UP \$300 FROM '68

Starting salaries for Oregon public school teachers are now in the \$6,200-\$7,000 range -up from last year's \$5,900 -\$6,800 -- according to Kathryn Smith, Oregon State University director of teacher placement.

"The average for the firstyear teacher with a bachelor's degree will be about \$6,500 for the academic year," Mrs. Smith noted. This is approximately \$300 above the 1968-69 average for beginning salar-

Those with master's degrees generally receive an additional \$200 to \$300 for first-year teaching, she explained.

The OSU teacher placement director indicated that some 500 school district personnel and college officials visit the placement bureau each year seeking and interviewing candidates. Thousands send in vacancy notices. "An oversupply of teacher

fers from the nation's community and four-year colleges also come to the OSU placement office. These requests are for highly-trained personnel and set as a minimum qualification, a master's degree in the subject matter field to be taught.
