NOTICE OF SCHOOL ELECTION

Upon Question of Increasing Tax Levy Over Amount Limited by Section 11, Article XI, Oregon Constitution.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that an election will be held in School District No. 61 of Malheur County, State of Oregon, from 8:00 a.m. to 8 p.m. on May 31, 1969, at the Adrian Elementary School in said school district, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of said district the question of increasing the tax levy for the fiscal year 1969-1970 over the amount limited by Section 11, Article XI, of the Constitution of Oregon.

The reasons for increasing such levy are: Adrian School District #61 has no tax base. This money is needed to operate the School.

The amount of tax, in excess of the constitutional limitation, proposed to be levied for said fiscal year is \$269,813.50, which, expressed as a rate of levy, is estimated at \$17.90 per thousand dollars of true cash value of taxable property within the district.

Other NHS golfers are Mark Peterson, Brian Hirai, Bruce

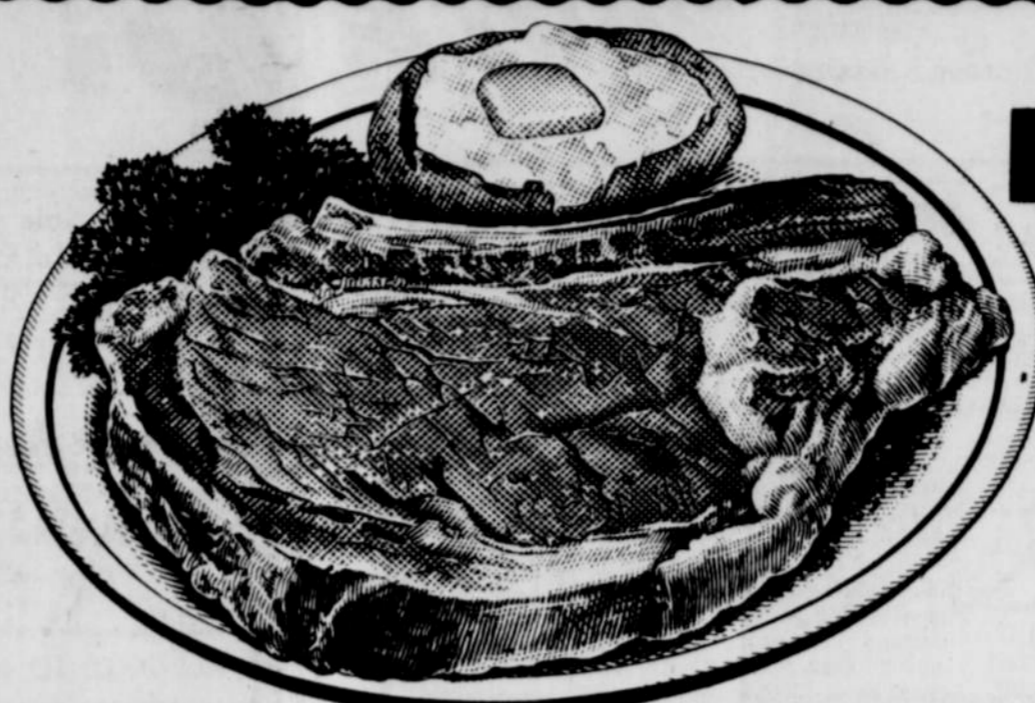
