Health Officer Advises Mumps Immunization

Mumps, an ancient disease that often produces a high fever, swollen glands in the face and neck and even more serious complications, continues to appear in Oregon in significant numbers even though a safe vaccine to prevent it has been licensed for more than a year.

Dr. Edward Press, State Health Officer, said 246 cases of mumps had been reported in Oregon from January 1 to April 26, 1969. He advised that those susceptible to the disease obtain immunizations from private physicians.

Dr. Press pointed out that while mumps is usually a mild virus disease it may on occasion be severe and produce serious complications. Encephalitis (brain fever) has been estimated to occur in about 10 per cent of patients and swelling of at least one of two glands involved in reproduction in about 20 to 30 per cent of post-pubertal males.

Known medically as orchitis, this latter complication in adolescent and adult males is painful, often requires long absences from work and school and in rare cases can curtail the ability to reproduce.

The comparatively new mumps vaccine produces long-lasting immunity (perhaps for life), and is recommended for all infants over one year of age and adults who have not had the disease.

Immunization prior to exposure to the disease is necessary, Dr. Press said, since about 28 days are required for the vaccine to develop protective antibodies in the system.
