OEO Migrant Education

Types of Programs now operational through Treasure Valley Community College's Migrant Education Program at the college level are:

1. Head of Household tuition, books, fees, and stipend program funding for 15 participants. Students under this program would have to meet the requirements of high school graduation, GED, or be working towards completion of GED requirements. All college expenses of normal registration would be paid. In addition, a current basic stipend of \$38 per week, plus \$3 per dependent up to four dependents would be allowed to each trainee.

2. Single Student Program of tuition, books, and fees to study at the college; funding for 35 students. This student does not receive a stipend, but is allowed \$5 per week for which he is to contribute some part-time work in the program. This student should be a high school graduate, have completed GED, or is working on the same.

3. Head of Household Full-time ABE (Adult Basic Education) program for five months with stipend; funding for 60 students. For students who are lacking in English as a second language skills and basic education. Would be functioning at a 0-8 grade level. Commences in November and proceeds to April. The program is held in the Lease Building where the ESL and ABE skills are learned. Commencing in January there is a pre-vocational exploratory program in addition to the ESL and ABE skills. Receive current basic stipend also.

4. Three month Head of Household Stipend program for study of GED and a vocational skill; funding for 20 students. For the student who is capable of functioning at an 8th grade or better level, who can continue his studies towards a GED and study a vocational skill at the college. Student receives current basic stipend. Program for Winter Term only.

5. Part-time Basic Education

Approximately 500 people participated in these classes in the past year.

SELF-HELP HOUSING:

Loans from the Farmers Home Administration are made to individual families to build their own homes. The program furnishes the technical assistance required to build the houses. This amounts to between \$1,600 and \$1,700 per completed home. Families learn a great deal about building a home as well as learning about commitment to a long term loan, interest payments, property taxes, and budgeting. They sign an agreement to work on all the houses in the group and no one moves into their home until all of them are completed.

We have completed 10 homes in Nyssa. Twenty-six others are under construction in Nyssa, Weiser, and Payette and will be completed this year. A group is being formed in Vale which should start building this summer. Another group will start in the Burley, Idaho area soon. Families are allowed 12 months to complete their homes.

A credit union for farm workers was initiated about a year and a half ago. There are 224 members in the credit union and its present assets are \$3,537.

The migrant programs operate in both the states of Oregon and Idaho. Funds to operate programs in both states were funded to Treasure Valley beginning this spring.
