



PLAN JULY 3 WEDDING

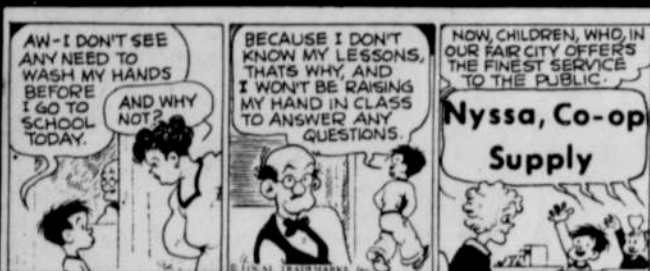
