point average.

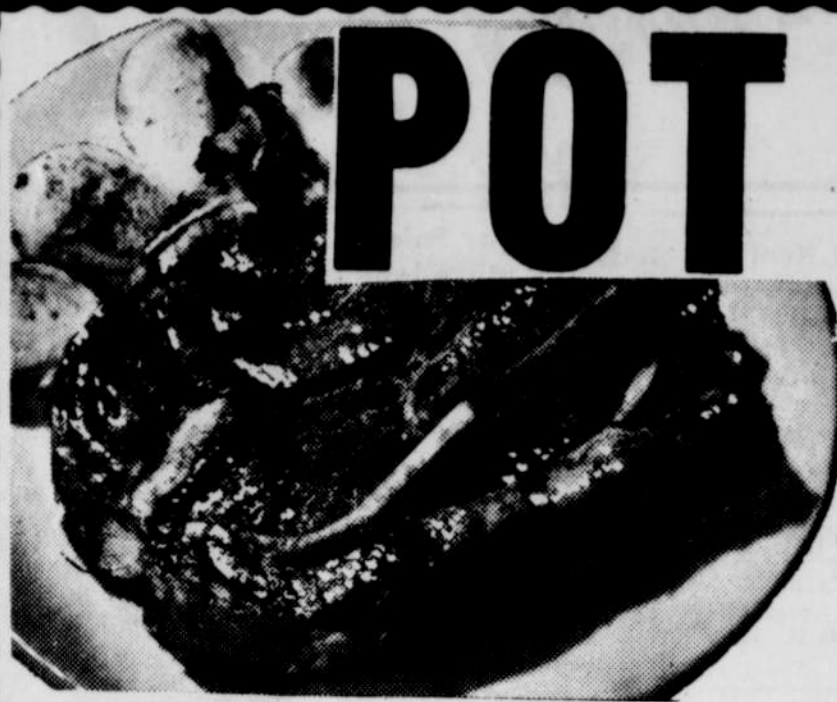
