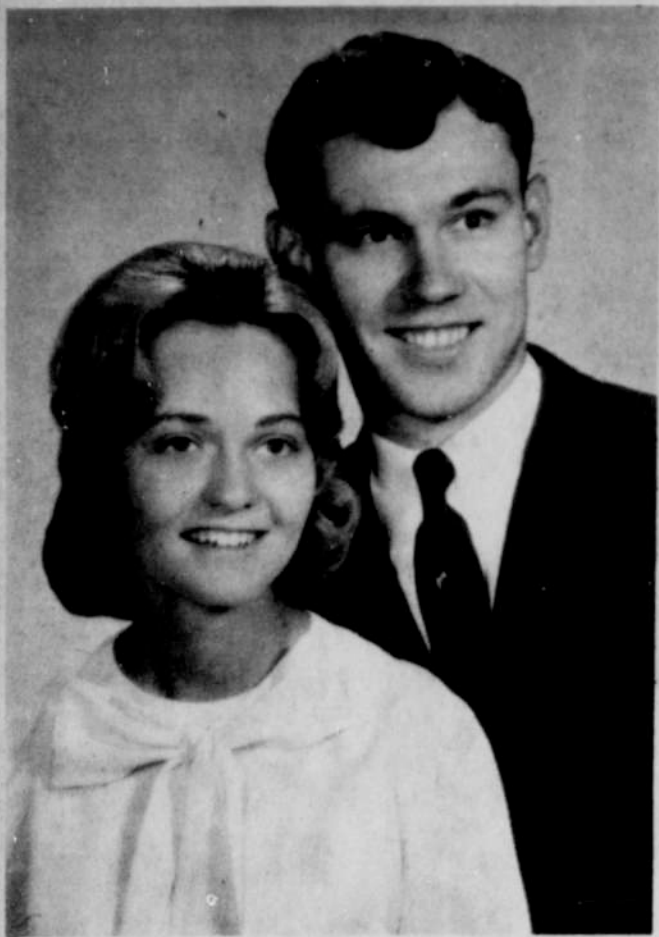




PLAN AUGUST 28 WEDDING

Mr. and Mrs. Cecil Houston, Mrs. George Hust and girls attended a July 27 Shaw reunion at Council.

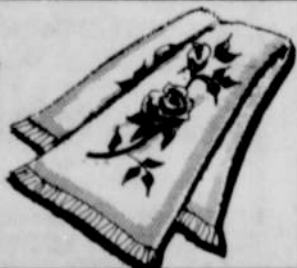

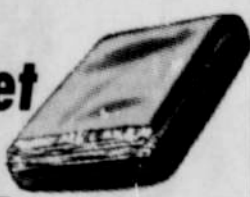
