Mr. and Mrs. K. I. Peterson attended the Aug. 17 World War I Barracks picnic at the Nyssa South Park.

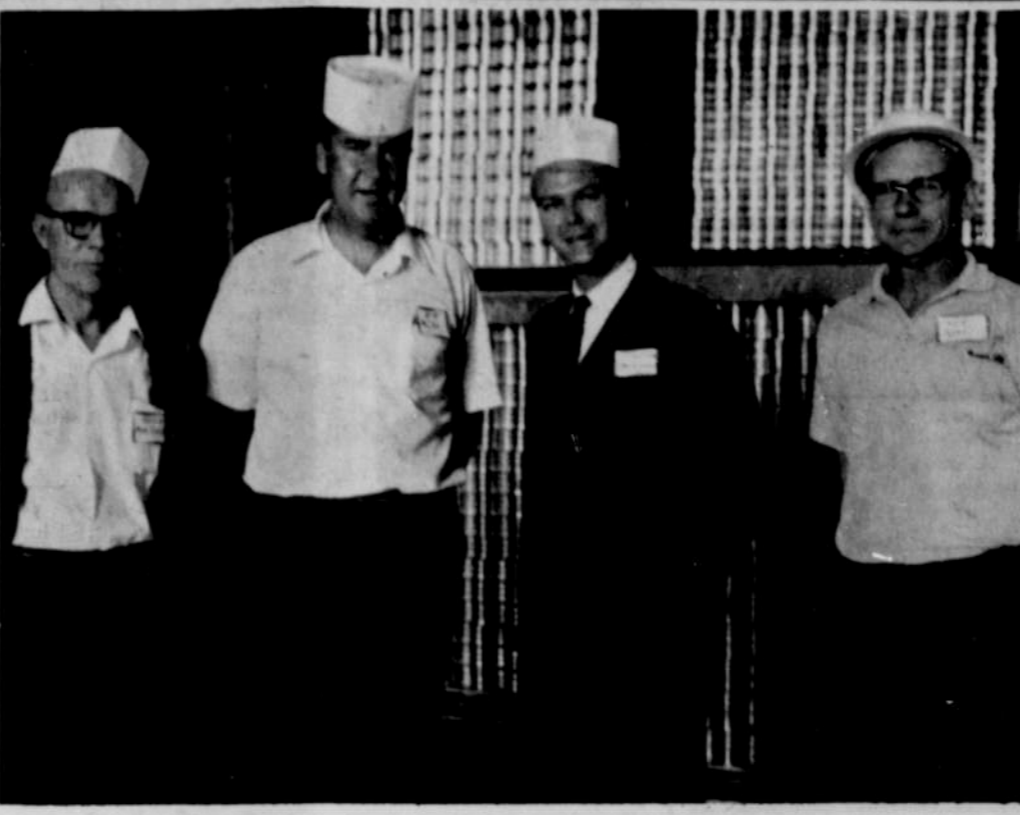
