Registration will begin at 9 a.m. with a coffee and "get-acquainted" time. School will begin at 9:30 a.m. sharp, led by the invocation, Pledge of Allegiance, and introductions. 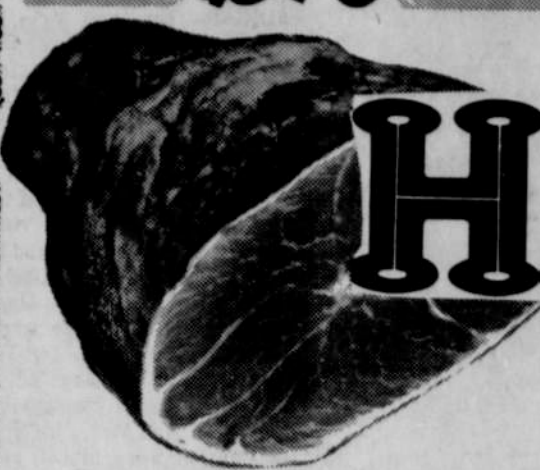

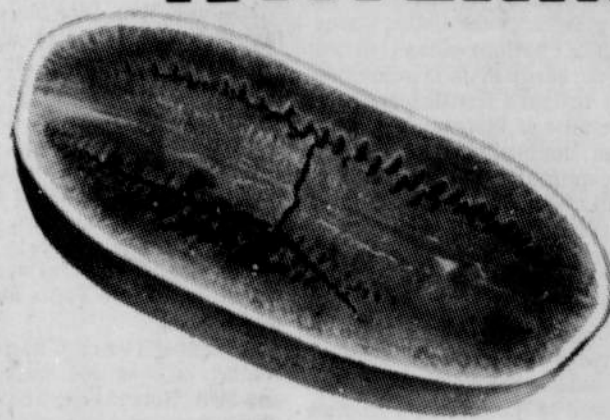

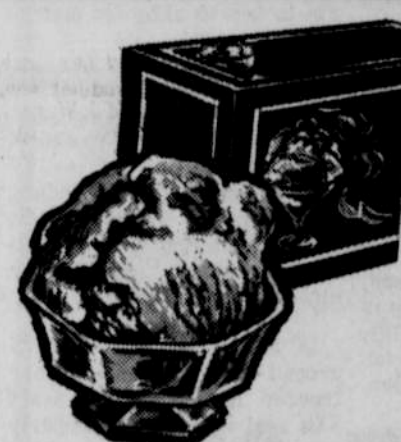
