Armed Service Academy Post Exams Slated

Congressman Al Ulman announced that the Civil Service Commission examination for nomination to the armed services academies will be given on Saturday, October 4. All young men interested in competing for a nomination to the Air Force, Merchant Marine, Military or Naval Academy are urged to immediately write to his office and request an application. Inquiries should be directed to: Congressman Al Ulman, 2410 House Office Building, Washington, D. C. 20515

Mr. Ulman's nominations are based to the results of this competitive Civil Service examination and on the recommendation of school officials. The test will be given in the cities of Albany, Baker, Bend, Burns, Enterprise, Hermiston, Hohn Day, Klamath Falls, La Grande, Lakeview, Ontario, Pendleton, Prineville, Salem, and The Dalles. Testing can be arranged in other areas of the state or the country to accommodate second district residents who are away from home. Requests to take part in this competition must be received in the Congressman's office by September 25.

To be eligible, an applicant must be between the ages of 17 and 22, unmarried, of good moral character, in good physical condition, capable of college-level work, and a legal resident of the second district of Oregon. Young men now serving in the Armed Services are eligible also.

Federal Loans Bolster Local Small Businesses

Over \$6 million in loans to 136 small businessmen were approved during the 1969 Fiscal Year by the Boise Regional Office of the Small Business Administration, Regional Director Oliver T. Davis announced today.

"Loans committed by the Boise Region total \$6,072,500," Davis said, "representing an average loan per firm of about \$44,650. Loans ranged in size from \$4,000 to \$310,000. Local Banks and other commercial lenders supplied most of the loan funds under guarantee by the federal agency or supplied matching funds ranging from 25% upwards in participation with SBA."

Ninety-seven percent of all regional SBA general business loan commitments were through banks in FY 1969, Davis pointed out, representing significant increases over FY 1968 when banks were involved in 77% of agency loans and FY 1967 when only 73% of SBA lending was in cooperation with banks.

SBA may guarantee business loans made by commercial lenders, or participate with up to 75% of the needed funds, Davis explained. Direct SBA loans are available under the Economic Opportunity Program when commercial lenders are unable to help.

The lending program, one of many services to small businessmen, helps create new businesses and expands operations, Davis said, thus creating new jobs and strengthening local economies for years to come.

While SBA lending represents only a small portion of commercial business loans in the Region, the impact is significant, Davis emphasized. All SBA loans are for terms ranging up to 15 years and are made only to firms to whom

this type of credit is not otherwise available. "During Fiscal Year 1969, the Boise SBA Office approved 92% of all loan applications, a significant increase over the 78% ratio of the year before. This is, in large part, accounted for by a higher caliber of Applicant. No losses have been recorded on loans made through the Boise Office during the past two years," Davis related, "and current repayment delinquency has remained at less than 1% for many months."

Breaking out Boise Office lending by area, Davis identified the Southwest Idaho area (including Boise) with 46 loans, \$2,184,000; Eastern Oregon with 12 loans totaling \$534,000, and Northern Nevada with five loans amounting to \$358,000. South Central Idaho's 24 borrowers utilized \$1,272,000 of SBA committed funds, 26 Southeast Idaho firms received \$829,600 and in the Upper Snake River and North Central area, 23 firms borrowed \$894,400.

During this same period, 20 loans totaling \$1,656,537 were made to businessmen in Northern Idaho through the Spokane SBA Regional Office.

The Boise Regional SBA Office serves six counties in Eastern Oregon, 34 counties of Southern Idaho, and four counties of Northern Nevada.
