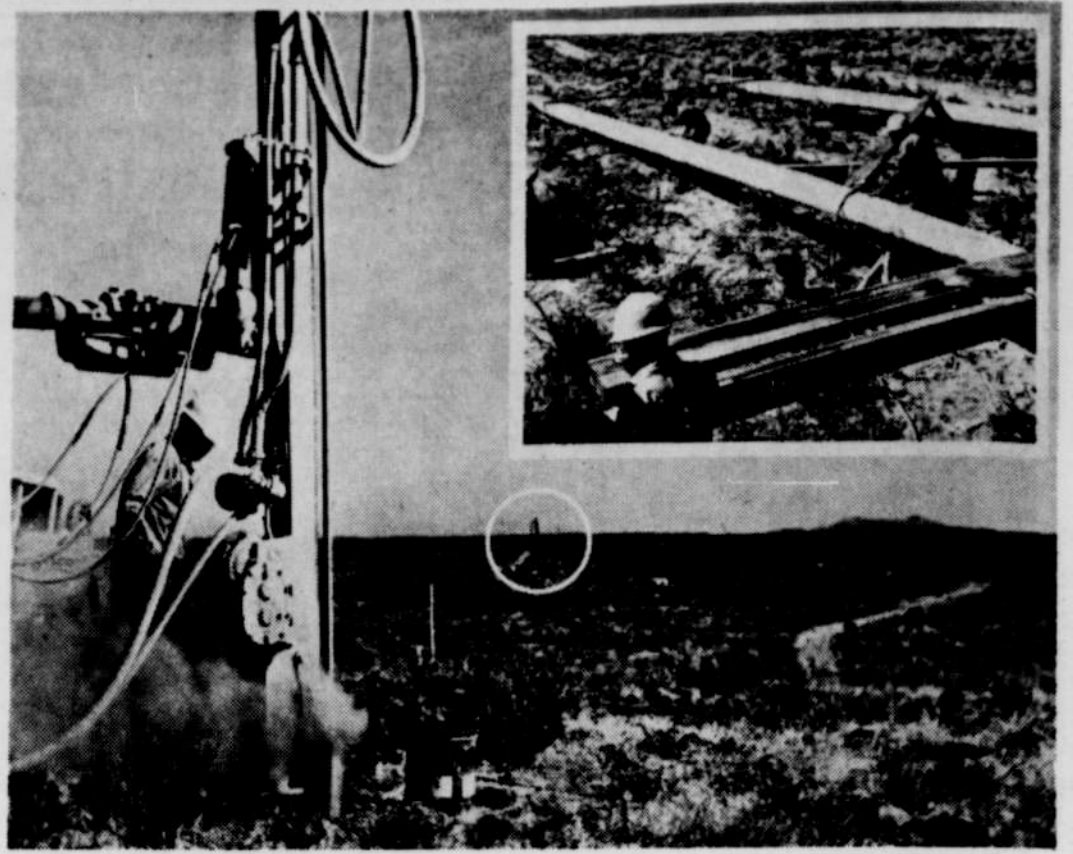

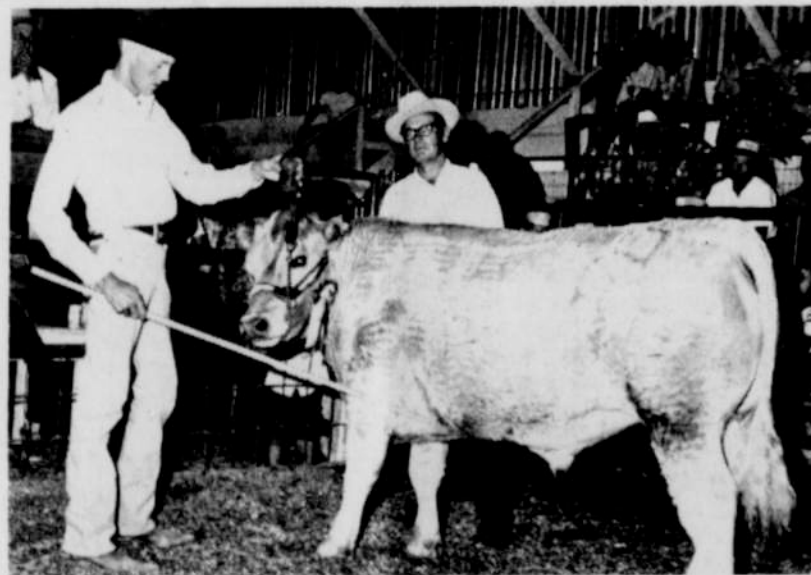
Armour and Company of Nampa and the Coast Packing Company of Ontario set the support price on beef.
