News About SERVICEMEN

Airman Harold L. Corfield, USN, is serving aboard the attack aircraft carrier USS Ticonderoga which recently returned to San Diego after seven months in the Western Pacific.

He is a son of Mrs. Bonnie Winn of Nyssa; and the husband of the former Dolores E. MacPherson of Ontario.

The Ticonderoga spent most of its tour on Yankee Station just off the coast of Vietnam. It served there as a unit of the US Seventh Fleet's carrier striking force.

During four line periods on Yankee Station, the Ticonderoga launched air strikes in support of allied forces fighting in Vietnam.
