Thirty-six seniors have attended the Boise State college production of Shakespeare's "The Tempest." The Advanced Placement English group, after dining at the King's Table, viewed the drama Monday night. Students from English IV classes saw the production Tuesday evening.

The Shakespearean play was the last to be written by the English dramatist, and often hailed as the Bard's finest. The play blends comedy, realism and fantasy built around a theme of freedom, a theme just as relevant to contemporary audiences as it was to players in the 16th Century.

Chaperoning groups of students to cultural offerings in the local area is nothing recent for English department chairman Clyde T. Swisher. "I believe that students should see drama to supplement their reading in the classroom. Reading drama is only second best to seeing live theatre. Plays were written to be seen."

"Whenever it's possible I'm pleased to sponsor student trips to dramatic offerings as well as musical events. For many of our students the attendance at a play or concert on a college campus is a first experience. After one exposure students are eager to pursue other cultural events."
