

COMMEMORATIVE POSTAGE STAMP

U.S. 6¢ POSTAGE



DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER

The 6-cent stamp honoring President Dwight D. Eisenhower will be first placed on sale on October 14, 1969 at Abilene, Kansas, where he spent his boyhood and where he is buried. This vertical stamp will be jumbo size, measuring 1.05 by 1.80 inches. It will be issued in panes of 32 - eight stamps across and four stamps down. The stamp, designed by Robert J. Jones of the Bureau of Engraving and Printing, is based on a photograph made by Bernie Noble of the Cleveland Press. This photograph captures the grin which was President Eisenhower's trade-mark. Mrs. Dwight D. Eisenhower approved the selection.

The lettering across the top of the design is blue and that at the bottom is red. The vignette is black. It was printed on the Giori Presses. The initial printing order is 120 million.

Collectors desiring first day cancellations may send addressed envelopes, together with remittance to cover the cost of the stamps to be affixed, to the Postmaster, Abilene, Kansas 67410. The outside envelope should be endorsed "First Day Covers Eisenhower Stamp," and postmarked no later than Oct. 14, 1969. Since this is an over-sized stamp, envelopes must be addressed as close to the bottom as possible.
