"PAINT YOUR WAGON" SCHEDULED FOR PORTLAND PREMIERE

Paint Your Wagon, a musical roadshow picture from Paramount Pictures, will have its Pacific Northwest Premier in Portland on Oct. 29. The picture, starring Lee Marvin, Clint Eastwood, and Jean Seberg, was filmed near Baker, Oregon, last summer. It is reportedly the largest budget picture ever made entirely within the United States, let alone within the State of Oregon.

Premiere night will be a glittering evening along Portland's Broadway. Governor Tom McCall will be present as a guest of the Portland YWCA. The YWCA is sponsoring the premiere evening as a benefit for its Camp Westwind.

From Hollywood, tentative arrangements as of this time include appearance to Alan Jay Lerner, producer of the picture and the man who scored the

original Broadway musical Paint Your Wagon, and Lee Marvin. Ray Walston, who was in Portland and Seattle recently to promote the picture, has evidenced interest in returning for the premiere.

FILMED AT BAKER

Nearly every scene of Paint Your Wagon was filmed on location outside Baker. The magnificent color, wide-screen photography will bring the Pacific Northwest's grandeur before the eyes of the world. The stars and production crew of Paramount literally took over the city of Baker last summer, hiring townspeople for roles, renting private homes, filling hotels, motels, and restaurants, and buying nearly every item used in producing the picture from local stores. Carpenters and all lumber, nails, and shin-

gles used in erecting the picture's "No Name City" were obtained locally by Paramount. . . hundreds of hippies from every part of the country even appeared on the scene and took up residence in the wild country surrounding the filming location; many of them were used in the picture because their long hair and beards fit in perfectly with the rustic pioneer gold mining setting of the story.

The Northwest's grandeur will be seen across the country in nationwide exposure of Paramount's tv featurette - it has already been seen across the country on both CBS and NBC television.

Premiere night in Portland will find nearly 300 people from Baker in attendance. They're attending the YWCA benefit to see themselves and their countryside on film, and they'll be arriving in Portland by private auto, train, plane and bus.

Paint Your Wagon is scheduled to open at the Paramount Theatre in Portland where it is predicted to run for at least six months to a year without interruption. Group discounts are available to schools and organizations by contacting the theatre or publicity office.
