NYSSA BEATS BURNS, 26 - 14

Nyssa's Bulldogs chewed up the Burns Highlanders 26-14 in their Homecoming game Friday evening. Led by Kieth Oldemeyer with three touch-

downs, Nyssa scored in the 1st, 2nd and 4th quarters, while Burns tightened their defense in the 3rd quarter and scored two touchdowns to give the Bulldogs a scare.

The first Nyssa score came on a 1-yard plunge by Dave Manley after the team marched steadily down the field. Oldemeyer scored on a 2-yard plunge in the 2nd quarter, and a pass from Manley to Steve Ross added 2 points. Later in the quarter, Oldemeyer scored again on a 6-yard run, but a run for the extra points was short.

In the 3rd quarter the game was a different story. Burns plugged the holes in their de-

fense, and capitalized on three 15-yard penalties against the Bulldogs. The first nullified an 80-yard runback of the opening kick-off by Ross, and the other two seemed to give Burns new life as they scored 14 points to close the gap.

Nyssa came back strong in the fourth quarter and made the final touchdown on a 20-yard pass from Manley to Oldemeyer to end the scoring.

The Bulldogs have now won 3, lost 4 in over all games, and their 7-A-2 record is 2 wins, 1 loss. The team travels to John Day Friday and winds up the season at Weiser on October 31.
