PANTS FOR WOMEN FEATURED IN OSU SEWING BULLETIN

Off the press in time for Christmas sewing is a new publication, "Pants for Women," written by Elaine K. Carlson, Extension clothing specialist at Oregon State University.

The 12-page circular contains directions for making pants with side seams, zipper placket, applied waistbands, and a lining.

As Miss Carlson indicated in the introduction to the text, pants have become an important part of the modern wardrobe. Although their names and style changes with fashion, pant-type garments always require a good fit.

To help the seamstress achieve this fit, the OSU clothing specialist gives pointers for selecting the right size pattern and the appropriate fabric. She has included a table for recording personal and pattern measurements to determine whether alterations are necessary. The booklet also contains easy-to-understand illustrations of each step of the sewing project.
