Senator Hatfield Introduces Bill On Smoking In Planes

Senator Mark Hatfield introduced legislation today to regulate smoking on passenger aircraft.

The bill would restrict smoking to a certain area of the plane. The bill calls for the Secretary of the Department of Transportation to draw up "reasonable rules and regulations" governing separating those who wish to smoke from those who do not like cigarette smoke.

"The rights of the non-smokers to fly free from the danger and irritating effects of smoke must be protected," said Hatfield. "The advent of the

jumbo jet increases the need for such legislation."

Hatfield noted that a segment of people whose systems react violently to cigarette smoke would be able to fly if his bill is approved. In addition, Hatfield said there is "some indication that cigarette tar build-up on the exhaust-overflow ducts might be a potential safety hazard."

A petition was filed Wednesday by Action on Smoking and Health with the F.A.A. and Department of Transportation urging similar action be taken by administrative channels. Hatfield supported the two-pronged approach and believed the petition will assist in bringing public attention to the problem. Ralph Nader has petitioned the F.A.A. for a complete ban on smoking on passenger aircraft.
