TIME TO RENEW **GAME LICENSES**

The Oregon Game Com mission reminds outdoorsmen that it's time to renew hunting and fishing licenses for the coming 1970 season. These documents are available at all license agencies and the Commission's Portland head-

quarters. New licenses are especially important to steelhead fishermen, with this season in full swing through the winter months and into spring. New licenses are also important to the hunter if he intends to be in the field after the first of the year. For the waterfowl hunter the new license is a must. Outdoorsmen are reminded, however, that a hunting license is needed to hunt for any wildlife of the state, including predators and
