School Lunch Programs Will Receive More Federal Money In 1970

Schools of this state will have more than half a million dollars extra in federal lunch money next year, it was announced today by Lyle Riggs, coordinator of school food services for the Oregon Food Service. A total of \$6,337,990 was appropriated for free and reduced-price meals, for breakfasts and for kitchen and cafeteria equipment. This was \$556,048 more than Oregon schools had available last year, Riggs said. Biggest increase was in the amount allowed for free breakfasts. Up to 15 cents per breakfast is allowed, with a total of \$115,130 set aside for this purpose. But relatively few schools take advantage of the federal breakfast allocation, Riggs said. Last year, \$57,694 was available and less than 25 percent of it was used. "The total has been doubled, because in some areas, many children go to school without breakfast," the state's food service coordinator explained. Free lunches can be served to more than 20,000 needy youngsters per day, from the \$467,856 tagged for this purpose. Last year the amount was only \$220,541. Allowance for the special milk program was upped slightly, from \$592,667 to \$596,046. And the estimated value of federal food donations was raised from \$3,446,149 to \$3,582,369. "Some communities will be eligible for as much as 75 percent of the cost of equipment to start a school lunch program," Riggs pointed out. This year \$88,552 is available, as compared to only \$6,749 last year. Reimbursement of \$1,488,037 on basic lunches, up from \$1,456,142, completes the government's appropriation for Oregon schools in the coming year.
