ULLMAN SAYS BOX CAR SHORTAGE TO BE RELIEVED

Rail box cars to relieve freight car shortages in eastern Oregon are now in route from mid-western rail terminals, Congressman Al Ullman said today. Ullman said he was advised by Interstate Commerce Commission Chairman Virginia Mae Brown that the agency has ordered immediate assistance to the Union Pacific Railroad, which is experiencing the box car shortage.

Mrs. Brown, replying to Ullman's request for relief of eastern Oregon wheat farmers and lumbermen, said extra cars are on the way from Missouri and Iowa rail terminals. "Further help will be given to the greatest possible extent," the ICC chairman added. Ullman said that while he was pleased with the ICC action, it is "only a temporary solution to a chronic problem." The Oregon Democrat said, "I am introducing legislation today that offers a long term answer by giving the ICC the teeth it needs to be truly effective in this problem area."

Ullman's bill would grant the ICC clear authority to employ penalty per diem charges on railroads failing to return cars within reasonable time to owner railroads. Ullman said, "my bill would place the burden of responsible action where it belongs, on those railroads retaining the equipment that should rightfully be returned to its owners. For years, the western railroads have been the losers in this malpractice."

Ullman said, "my bill would clarify the extent of the ICC's authority in this area, and allow the agency to move rapidly and effectively in meeting future rail car shortages."

DROPOUTS IN HIGH SCHOOLS DECREASE

High school dropouts have decreased dramatically in Oregon during the last 17 years, according to figures released by the Oregon Board of Education. In 1952 only 63.8 percent of the students finished high school. Last year 81.5 percent of the young people who had entered high school were

still around to pick up diplomas.

Significantly, over one-half of the dropouts from the last four graduating classes left high school after entering their senior year.

The total of 30,537 high school graduates last year was a new high for the state. The previous high came in 1965 when 29,998 received diplomas. But the figures show a greater percentage (82.6%) of students per-

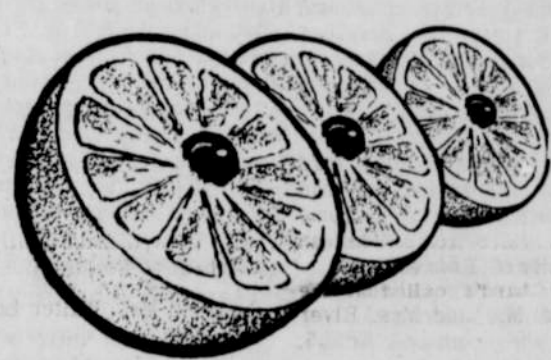
