

CAMPING TRAILERLAW REQUIRES LICENSES PRIOR TO MARCH 31

Oregon camper owners now have three months in which to license their units. A new law takes effect January 1 requiring owners to license and obtain a title for campers prior to March 31, 1970, according to Chester W. Ott, Motor Vehicles Division administrator.

Ott said owners may apply for a license at any field office of the agency. There is a \$2 title fee and a basic registration fee of \$10, plus \$1.50 per foot for each foot over 10 feet. The minimum length and measurement fee is based on the floor, excluding the cab overhang.

In addition to completing an application form for registration, camper owners will be asked to complete an "affidavit of ownership" form, Ott said. The affidavit will indicate the make, year model, assigned identification number and length of the camper, as well as information about purchase of the camper. It is unnecessary to bring campers to offices to register them, since many units are stored during winter months.

Ott says the agency has estimated there are 20,000 campers subject to registration. "We have no way of knowing

the exact number in the state, however, until the registration process is completed," he said.

Campers are defined as units designed for human habitation or camping with a separate camper floor of six feet or more in length and an inside height of five and one-half feet or more. A unit without a separate floor is not legally a camper, even though it may be used for camping purposes," he said.

Camper owners will be issued a black license plate with white numbers and a small, metal identification tag. These must be displayed on the rear of the camper on the lower left side. The new law also changes the method of calculating fees for mobile homes, travel trailers and motor homes.

New license plates will be issued to travel trailers and motor homes as their previous plates expire on a monthly basis during 1970. Mobile home plates will be validated with a sticker.

Travel trailer and motor home owners whose units have been previously licensed will be asked to surrender their current plates to the Motor Vehicles Division before the new travel trailer or motor home plates may be issued.

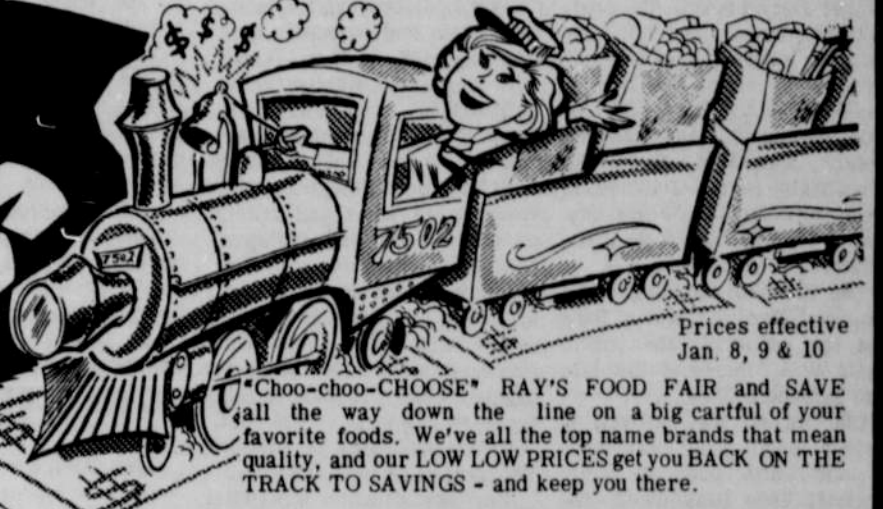
