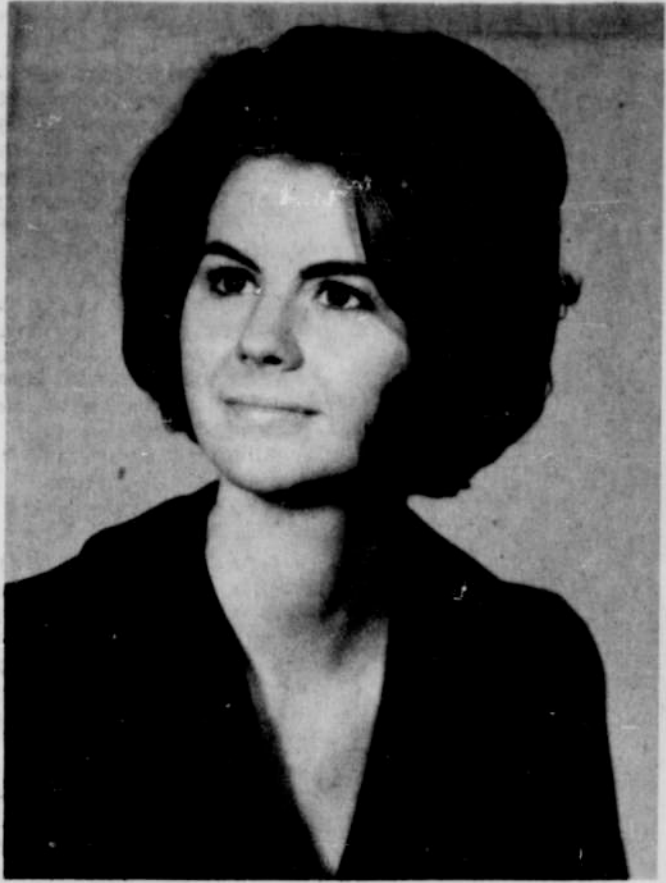


Engagement Announced
