These and other questions will be discussed at a series of meetings on Food Preservation that will be held in Vale and Ontario in July and August, according to Helen Conner, Malheur County Extension Agent.

Pre-registration is required for the free meetings which will be of interest to young homemakers who want to do some food preservation for the first time.
