

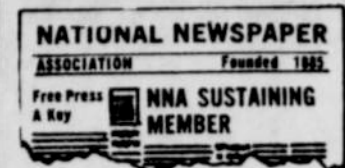

COMPETITION FOR NROTC COLLEGE PROGRAM STARTS

The 25th annual national competition for the Naval Reserve Officers Training Corps (NROTC) College Scholarship Program has commenced.

The NROTC College Scholarship Program prepares a young man for a Navy or Marine Corps commission while he is studying at one of the many civilian colleges and universities where NROTC Units are established. All tuition, fees, uniforms, and books are furnished by the Navy, and the student receives \$50 per month subsistence allowance for four years. During the summers between academic years, the student participates in interesting at-sea training periods as a Midshipman. After successfully completing a baccalaureate level college course and all military requirements, he is commissioned in the Regular Navy or Marine Corps.

Applicants for this program will be considered based on scores obtained on either the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) of the College Entrance Examination Board (CEE), Princeton, New Jersey, or the American College Test (ACT) of the American College Testing Program, Iowa City Iowa, in lieu of the Navy College Aptitude Tests (NCAT) previously utilized.

Applicants for the 1971 NROTC College Scholarship Program must: -Apply for and take either test specified above at their own expense prior to 31 December 1970. -Arrange with the appropriate testing agency for the submission of their scores to the NROTC College Scholarship Program. -Apply for the NROTC College Scholarship Program between 1 April 1970 and 1 December 1970 in accordance with the 1971 Bulletin of Information.

Eligible high school students and graduates should submit their applications before 1 December 1970. Application forms are available from high school counselors, the nearest Navy or Marine Corps Recruiting Station which is listed in your telephone directory, or from the Chief of Naval Personnel (Pers-B6411), Department of the Navy, Washington, D.C. 20370.

"Open Letter To Man"

In this era of preoccupation with sex and nudity under the guise of freedom of expression, a simple letter written to man about the image of womanhood is creating a lot of interest throughout the country. Some radio personalities such as Los Angeles' famous Dick Wittinghill have read it repeatedly on their radio programs.

Newspapers and magazines, both religious and secular, are reprinting it. And private citizens are copying it for distribution to their friends. This is what "Open Letter To Man" says: "I am a Woman. "I am your wife, your sweetheart, your mother, your daughter, your sister... your friend. I NEED YOUR HELP."

"I was created to give to the world GENTLENESS, UNDERSTANDING, SERENITY, BEAUTY AND LOVE. I am finding it increasingly difficult to fulfill my purpose. "Many people in advertising, motion pictures, television and radio have ignored my inner qualities and have repeatedly used me ONLY as a symbol of SEX

"This humiliates me; it destroys my dignity; it prevents me from being what YOU want me to be - an example of - "Beauty, Inspiration and love - "Love for my children, love for my husband, love of my God and my country.

"I need your help to restore me to my true position... to ALLOW me to fulfill the PURPOSE FOR WHICH I WAS CREATED. "I know you will find a way." This letter was written about ten years ago by songwriter Sy Miller and his wife, the former actress, Jill Jackson. But it wasn't until "Open Letter to Man" was discovered shortly after a year ago by the Rev. Francis J. Caffrey of the Maryknoll Fathers that it received widespread circulation.

Father Caffrey was so impressed with the letter that he got the Millers' permission to reproduce it. From that humble grass roots beginning, "Open Letter to Man" has developed its own quiet underground movement protesting the degradation of women as mere sex objects. Many prominent businessmen and entertainment personalities have assisted Father Caffrey in his efforts to help restore woman's proper image of love, beauty and dignity in our contemporary society.

R.D. Funk, Managing Editor of the Santa Monica (California) Evening Outlook was among the first to tell the story of the Millers', Father Caffrey and "Open Letter to Man" in his column. Since then the "Open Letter" has been reproduced and circulated widely in the U.S., in some foreign countries and is on its way to expanding its message of common decency throughout the world.

"Open Letter to Man" is a simple, powerful message challenging today's animalistic, sex-oriented image of womanhood. It's difficult today for a girl or young woman to believe anyone really cares about morality, femininity and virtue in our society. But the challenge is simply stated for all to meet, "I know you will find a way."
