

I am informed that the State System of Higher Education Thursday, Friday and Saturday. finds it cannot legally take action to dismiss Dr. Froines. This decision is based on the advice of the Attorney General

of Oregon, on a study of recent Federal court decisions in similar cases, and on the imprecise wording of rules for dismissal which heretofore were in effect. The board is taking action now, at my insistence, to formulate stricter and more precise rules--but these rules cannot lawfully be applied re-

troactively to remove Dr. Froines.

As a public official, I feel sense of frustration. I know what should be done, but there is no legal way this can be accomplished. No one needs to remind me that when I became Governor I swore to uphold the law. I cannot do an illegal act even if I believe I am doing it for a good purpose. If I did, I would


