#### Owyhee River

##### Re-stocked

The re-stocking of the Upper Owyhee River by the Oregon State Game Commission is now under way. Initial stocking included 28,000 channel catfish fingerling released at Rome on September 4 and an additional 12,000 released in the South Fork of the Owyhee River two miles above Three Forks on September 7. The channel catfish fingerling were reared in the Federal Fish Hatchery at Spearfish, South Dakota and were transported to the Owyhee River by tanker truck.  
In addition to the catfish, the South Fork of Owyhee River received a plant of 470 small mouth bass fingerling which were seined from the Middle Fork of the Malheur River below Drewsey. Additional plants of smallmouth bass fingerling will be made as the fish become available.  
On September 9, the first plant of 50,000 rainbow trout fingerling is scheduled to be made in the Three Forks area of Owyhee River. An additional 50,000 rainbow will be released in the lower area 14 miles above the Owyhee Reservoir on September 11. An additional 360,000 rainbow fingerling are scheduled to be stocked at a later date.

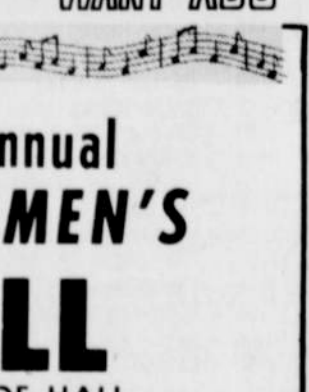
#### LOCAL BOYS ATTEND JUDO TOURNAMENT

#### Nyssa Loses To Bishop Kelly

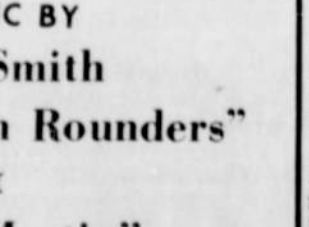

After the dust had settled from the second and third quarters defensive battle both squads tried to sustain a drive. Driving the ball to the two yard line, Nyssa fumbled and the knights recovered.

As for Iowa, Andros is hopeful Oregon State will make a rebound showing as it did last year for Iowa City. Earlier, the Beavers lost to UCLA, 37-0, and then came back the following week to record a convincing 42-14 decision over the Hawks.  
Oregon State came up with several injuries in the UCLA encounter. Probably out of the Iowa game with a sprained ankle is Mike Maestri, speedy sophomore offensive halfback. Rob Jurgenson, starting offensive guard, also is questionable and Fullback Dave Schilling probably will be okay for Iowa.  
Plenty of tickets still remain for the night game in Portland. OSU has not started classes yet, and choice students tickets are generally available. In the Portland area, tickets are on sale at the Civic Stadium, Meier & Frank's Downtown store and Stevens & Sons in the Lloyd Center.
