Welcome, Governor McCall!

Governor Tom McCall will be a Nyssa visitor Thursday (today), and it is a privilege for us to welcome him to our community and area.

It's very seldom that we see the governor of our state in Eastern Oregon, and we commend the governor for making an appearance here. We think it is particularly important that he is taking the time to visit with our school children, because they need to know who our chief executive is, and need to know how our political system works.

Governor McCall made a major speech to the peace officers of Oregon, Idaho and Washington last night at Baker, but primarily he is on a political campaign swing. So many politicians running for state office completely ignore this part of the state, and it isn't right. While we are a relatively small part of the Oregon population, we are still Oregonians, and those in high office need to know our problems and be familiar with this part of the state.

It may be potentially expedient for campaigners to spend their time in Western Oregon and the Willamette Valley where most of the people live, but exposure over the entire state can make a difference in a close election. We suspect that Bob Packwood is U.S. Senator now because he took the time to campaign all over Oregon two years ago, while Wayne Morse stayed pretty close to the population centers.

Political campaigns give the voters a chance to see and hear the candidates, but more important, we think, the candidates must lay their records and programs on the line and face the issues and the public.

Governor McCall is taking his time to come to this area and meet our people. We urge everyone who can possibly get away to see and hear the governor at the school assembly today, Thursday, October 22 at 12:50 p.m. He is a politician seeking re-election, but he is also the chief executive of this state. The problems he has faced in the past four years have been terrific, and there is little indication that they will be less in the next four years.

Come out and greet Governor McCall, and show our real Eastern Oregon hospitality.

No two pictures were the same, and one of his delights was the showing of slides of the Oregon country.

He loved music and had a large collection of records, some of which were classical. These he liked the most, but would not play them unless he was sure the listener enjoyed the same kind of music.

He was intensely interested in the wild life; the conditions of the streams and rivers, and he knew about ecology before it became a household word.

A large garden was planted prior to the last year, so the produce could be shared with friends and neighbors. Besides it was easier to care for than the elimination of weeds.

Books and magazines were a part of life in his home, many books being read several times. Surgery of the eyes 13 months ago prevented pursuit of his hobby as it did with work on the stamp collection.

He accompanied grade school children on numerous bus trips to areas where they found rocks, petrified wood and on some occasions, fossils. No child returned without a treasure, or he would be presented one from Corey's own supply.

Mr. Corey started a display of rocks and transparencies in the Nyssa school and the Nyssa library some time ago. He felt that all children should have the opportunity to see the beauty of Oregon as he did. Due to illness and confinement he was unable to see the completion of these projects.

We have lost two wonderful and sincerely graceful friends, Mrs. Corey passing away on October 30, 1969. Their door was always open, and a welcome extended for they shared the joys and sorrows of their friends.
