Rep. Rogers Morton, New Secretary Of The Interior

Congressman Rogers C.B. Morton (R), Maryland, has recently been appointed Secretary of the Interior by President Richard Nixon. Little known by most people in the West, his biography is presented, as follows:

Rogers Morton is a huge man, six feet 7, whose kinship with the elements of earth, air, and water parallels his 56 years. He first ran for Congress in 1962 because of his concern for the national environment and for the future of the mighty Chesapeake Bay. Then, as now, Morton operated a farm and commercial cattle feeding enterprise on the Eastern Shore of Maryland.

From election to the 88th Congress, and in each succeeding Congress, Rep. Morton has been a strong voice of conservation. During his first six years in the House of Representatives, he served on the Committee on Interior and Insular Affairs and on the Merchant Marine and Fisheries Committee. A strong supporter of realistic proposals for preserving and conserving wilderness areas and creating national parks, he drafted the basic legislation creating the Assateague Island National Seashore, enacted in 1965. While serving on the Public Land Law Review Commission, Morton worked on establishing a new government policy for the eventual determination of millions of square miles of public property. He assisted in drafting the legislation authorizing the preservation of the estuarine areas, enacted in 1968. He was responsible for legislation that authorized the Chesapeake Bay study and hydraulic model. The oil pollution control bill sponsored by Morton was in-

and came out a captain. He joined the family business of Ballard and Ballard Company, held various administrative posts including President, until merger with the Pillsbury Company in 1951.

In 1968, after he had served three terms in Congress, Rep. Morton was asked by Richard Nixon to be floor manager of his bid for the Presidential nomination at the Republican convention in Miami. Morton accepted and Mr. Nixon was nominated on the first roll call. Then, the towering Marylander placed the name of his Governor, Spiro T. Agnew, before the convention as candidate for Vice President. The following April, President Nixon requested that Mr. Morton assume the Chairmanship of the Republican National Committee, a post that Thruston Morton held during the Eisenhower years. Rogers Morton accepted the Chairmanship without compensation and in the 1970 off-year election he played a dual role... running for re-election himself and campaigning across the nation for Republican candidates.

Somehow, Rog Morton has found time to serve in capacities outside politics. He has been on the Advisory Board of the Air Training Command, U.S. Air Force. The Board engages in problem solving and consulting services to the Air Force and the position took Morton to air installations throughout the world. He has served on the United States Naval Academy's Board of Visitors since 1966 and on the Board of Governors of Washington College of Maryland since 1962.

Morton has known politics all his life. He was born in Louisville, Kentucky, to a family long active in public life in that state. His older brother, Thruston Morton, served in both the House and the U.S. Senate until his retirement in 1968. The younger Morton worked in his brother's campaigns in Kentucky, source material for the best anecdotes of both Mortons. Rogers Morton attended Woodberry Forest School in Virginia, went on to Yale University and graduated in 1937. In 1943, he entered the army as a private, served with the field artillery in the European Theatre,
