According to this tradition, St. Luke was an iconographer as well as a physician, and as such he created the first image of the Madenna, a painting that became the guide for many icons in later centuries.


As legend has it, St. Luke's icon of the Madonna and his other paintings were the forerunners of the style of artistic expression known as Byzantine art.




