



The stage is set for construction of the 1.5 million-kilowatt Jim Bridger steam generating plant some 30 miles northeast of Rock Springs, Wyoming. Machines like those seen working here have finished moving a million cubic yards of material to grade the site for the huge new source of essential energy Idaho Power Company will build jointly with Pacific Power & Light Company at an estimated cost of \$300 million. Foundation excavation and building erection

is due to start next spring as soon as weather at the isolated and wind-swept desert site near the Continental Divide permits. Underway too as part of the project has been access road and railroad spur construction. The plant's first 500,000-kilowatt unit is scheduled to go "on the line" in 1974 to supply Idaho Power customers. Three 345,000-volt transmission lines will tie the plant to the company's system in eastern Idaho.

Alien Registration Deadline Jan. 31

William L. Pattillo, District Director of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, today urged all aliens in the State of Oregon who have not yet filled out alien address report forms, to do so before January 31st, at the nearest Immigration and Naturalization Service Office or local Post Office.

The Immigration Official pointed out that the law requires all non-citizens, except persons in diplomatic status and foreign representatives to certain international organizations, such as the United Nations, to report their addresses to the Government each January.

Mr. Pattillo added: "The parent or legal guardian of an alien child under 14 years of age must fill out the address report form for such a child in order to comply with the law."

He declared: "We have tried to make it as convenient as possible for non citizens to meet the address report requirements; and, in view of serious penalties for willful violation, all persons subject to the address report law are urged to fulfill this obligation before the end of January."

Pattillo advised: "It is easy for an alien to meet this requirement. He just goes to the nearest Immigration and Naturalization Service Office or Post Office, fills out the address report form, and returns it to the clerk. Any non-citizen who is ill may send a friend or relative to obtain the card for him, and return it to the clerk after it has been completed by the alien."

The Immigration Official said 12,000 aliens in the State of Oregon have already filled out address reports. He estimated that 26,000 such reports will be submitted before January 31st.

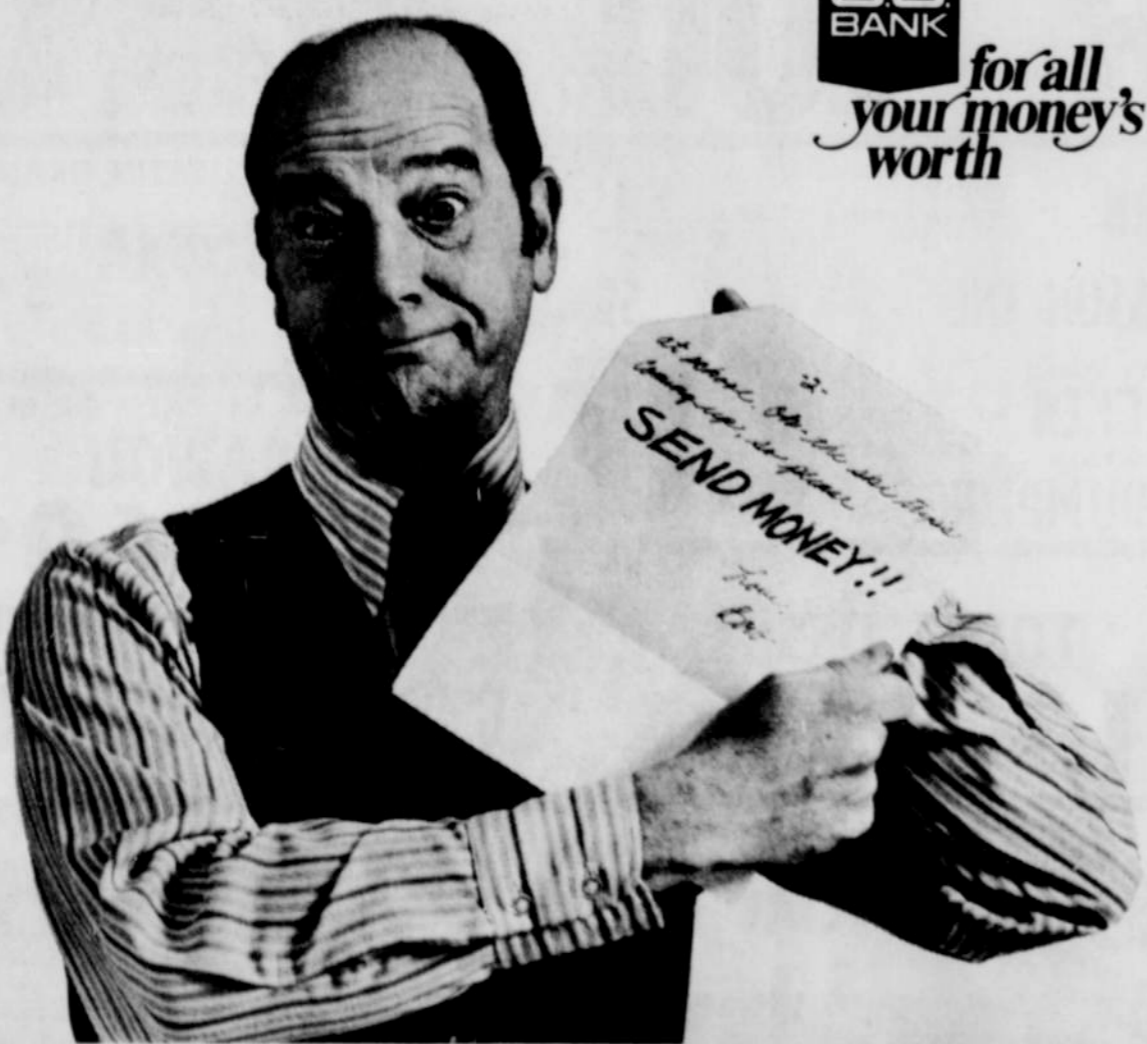
