BLM-DESCHUTES COUNTY TRADE

A Federal patent to 4,839.75 acres was handed the Deschutes County Court Tuesday by Don Robins, BLM District Manager at Prineville, to complete an equal value exchange with the Bureau of Land Management for 31,427 acres of county lands.

The appraisal of the combined offered and selected lands exceeded \$1,250,000 in value and was approved by the Assistant Secretary of the Interior for Public Land Management, Harrison Loesch, last week.

The new county lands are the higher value tracts in the Bend-Redmond area suitable for urban development. They have much greater potential for private development than those deeded to the Federal government.

The former County lands are located on the high desert between Horse Ridge and Hampton, and in the Cline Butte area. They have potential value for watershed, wildlife, livestock grazing, and public recreation, Robins said. Many tracts have potential for range reseeded projects. Most of these lands were foreclosed for nonpayment of taxes 30 to 40 years ago after dry homesteads were abandoned by settlers.

The County has previously leased the land for grazing.
