OREGON LIVESTOCK TAX VALUES SET

The Eastern Oregon livestock tax assessors meeting with representatives of the Oregon Cattlemen's Association in Boardman recently reached an agreement and have approved the following 1971 livestock tax appraisal figures.

Following are the approved assessors true cash values on livestock for 1971: BEEF CATTLE - Calves under 6 months, \$45; Calves 6 months to one year, \$115; Heifers, \$90; Steers one year and over, \$150; Heifers one to two years, \$130; Cows 2 years and over, \$155; Bulls one year and over, \$290.
