Mrs. Lane was Grand Representative of Ohio in Oregon.

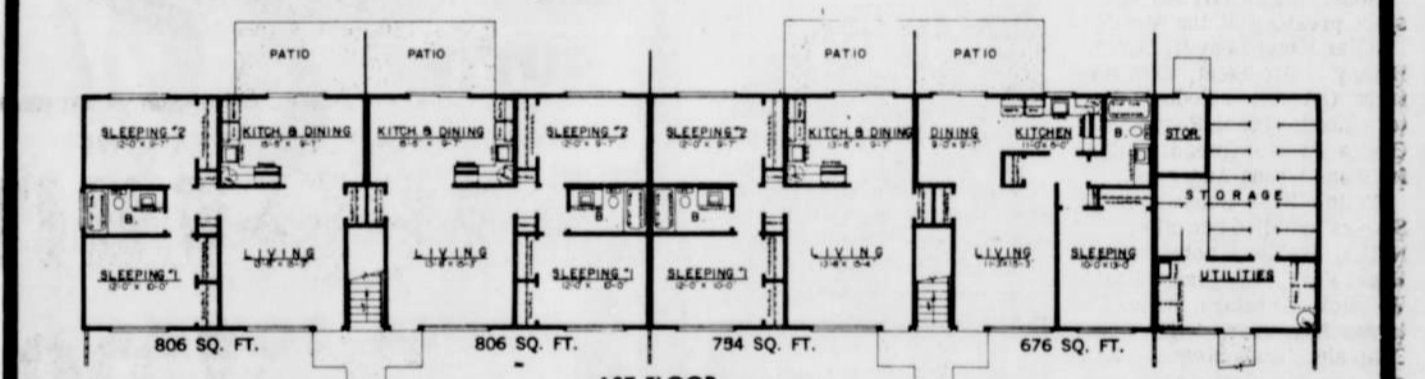
