

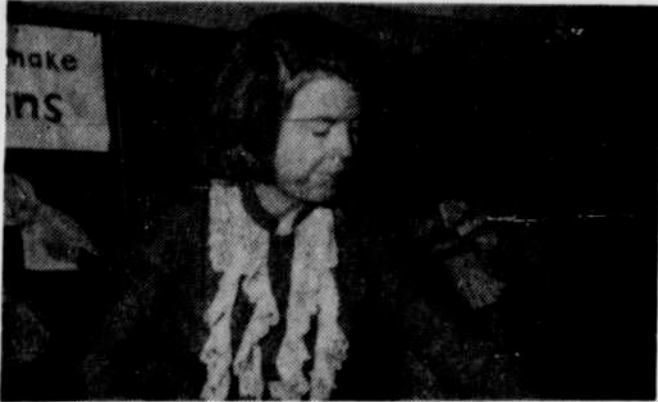
Adrian Poster Contest Winners
