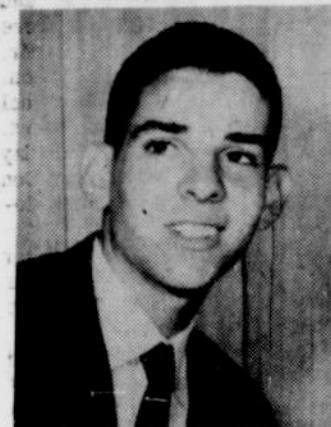


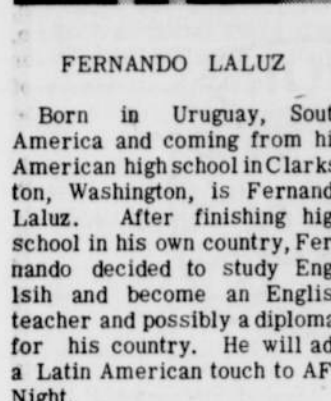
Nyssa To Honor AFS Students

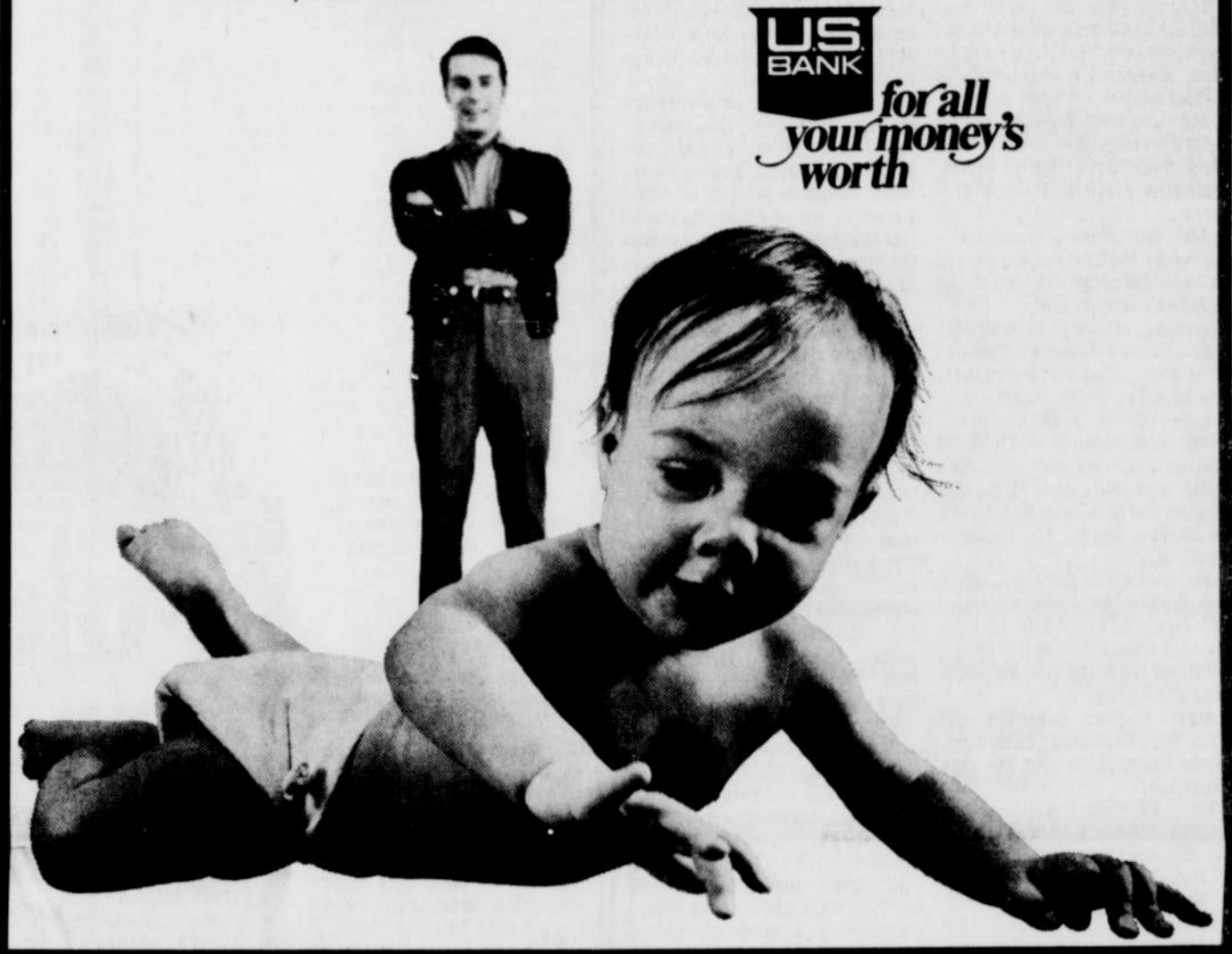
