## NYSSA SOPHOMORES IN TOURNEY FINALS

The Nyssa Sophomore team moved into the sophomore tournament finals by beating the Vale Sophs on Monday night at Ontario, 46-44.

The game was extremely close all the way with hardly more than two points separating the teams at any time during the game. Vale led 32-30 at halftime after sharing an 18-18 tie at the first quarter mark. Nyssa's tight defense held the Vikings to only seven shots and four points in the third quarter, while the Bulldogs picked up eight points to lead 38-36 at the end of the period. Kevin Engstrom made five points early in the fourth quarter to keep the Nyssa team in the game, while at the same time Vale scored eight points. Geren Manley's free throw tied the game again at 44-44 with 3:35 to go.

The Nyssa defense, coupled with good ball handling by Jerry Wilson and crew, kept the Vale team from scoring in the last half of the quarter, and Rod Lewis' final basket provided the winning margin. Lewis led all scorers with 19 points. Others in double figures were Hall and Moore, both from Vale and each with 11 points, and Nyssa's Geren Manley with 10. Lowell Wil-

liams and Jerry Wilson each had six points, and Engstrom's 5 completed the scoring for Nyssa. Pat Ross and John Bernal also saw action in the game.

As the sophomores come to the final game of the season on Wednesday night, their record is 19 wins and 3 losses. In the first game of the tournament last Thursday evening they beat Payette 53-45, and a win over Emmett Wednesday would give them their second championship in two years.
