

Both booklets, Your Federal Income Tax and Tax Guide for Small Business, are available from the Superintendent of Documents for seventy-five cents each.

Officials describe the booklets as "supplementing" pamphlets each taxpayer receives from the Internal Revenue Service, usually in January, along with his machine-readable tax form. The Guides contain more detailed information and aid taxpayers, in most cases, to complete their own returns ac-

curately and quickly. The Guides can be obtained from a number of government book stores throughout the country and by writing the Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20402.
