Herman came to Nyssa in 1921 working as a mechanic for C.C. Cotton in the Cotton Garage located at the head of which is now the underpass. He stayed with Cotton until 1926 when he decided to operate a garage himself, and opened his place of business in the Eddie Powell Service Station located where the Mall next to Bracken's Department Store is now.

Herman closed shop and left Nyssa to do some mining in Nevada and in Prairie City from 1934 until 1938 when he returned to Nyssa.

In 1938, he purchased a shop and remodeled it. This has been the Towne Garage located at 218 Main from 1938 until the present time. He also purchased his home in 1938 and still resides there with his wife

Myrl. Herman has not only been a garage and service man; he has been like an old country doctor. He would go to people's homes in emergencies and fix their sick cars to help them get to work on time, or to have their car ready, should they need it in a hurry.

He has been and is, a very active member in the Catholic Church and a most dependable worker in civic affairs concerning Nyssa and Nyssa progress.

Many citizens shall miss his friendly wave and smile as they pass his place. The show window of the garage, which was so full of blooming geraniums, gave one a happy, good feeling to start the day as one passed there on the way to work.

Sam Smiley Retires After 25 Year's Service

Sam W. Smiley, a resident in the Nyssa area since 1942, retired March 31, 1971, after 25 years' service with the Malheur County Farm Labor Association.

Sam's comment on his job was that he enjoyed his job, had a job to do and did it; but in interviewing Everett Heldt, whom he was closely associated with in his work, we learned more in the nature of Sam's work and the way he did it.

Heldt reported that Sam's 25 years of service with the Association has seen many changes in the type of labor and housing in the area. His first entrance in the program was as Manager of the Adrian Camp with the housing of Mexican Nationals.

At this time tent frames were used, kitchen facilities were operated and serving of food was done under separate contracts.

During the years, full camps of Negroes and Indians were housed. Finally the family-type workers, as we have at present,
