Hunters, Sport Fishermen Continue To Increase

Hunting and fishing continue to be among Oregon's major attractions as evidenced by license sales figures for 1970, released by the Oregon Game Commission, which reached close to the million mark.

License sales, excluding salmon-steelhead licenses, totaled 998,771 compared with 924,000 in 1969. Salmon-steelhead licenses are treated similarly to big game tags since a regular fishing or hunting license is a prerequisite to the other.

The number of regular angling licenses issued totaled 515,277, exceeding the half-million mark for the first time. In 1969 about 472,600 general angling licenses were issued. The figure includes combination licenses, resident angler, nonresident, vacation angler, and other general angling licenses but does not include the daily licenses. The number of daily licenses issued continued to soar with sport fishermen who angle occasionally purchasing 285,300 daily permits.

Salmon-steelhead licenses issued totaled 351,300, an increase of about 24,000 from the previous year. About 29,800 of these licenses were issued free to juveniles.

A new high of 371,400 hunting licenses were issued which includes licenses in all categories including combination. The previous record was set in 1968 when about 362,900 hunters obtained licenses. Almost 22,000 more hunting licenses were issued in 1970 than were issued in 1969.

Deer hunters increased substantially from the previous year with more than 291,400 nimrods obtaining deer tags. The record number of elk hunters set a new record, increasing by about 8,200 from 1969. Almost 73,500 elk tags were issued compared with the previous high of 68,800 tags issued in 1968.

Bryan Feik pitched seven innings and led the Nyssa nine in the first game with three rbi's to win by a 12-5 score. Ron Moffis also had two hits and drove in three Nyssa runs. Feik struck out 12 Prospectors and walked five.

In the second game Ken Vandewall pitched a two-hit ball game, striking out nine and walking seven, to win 7-0.
