Veterans' Affairs Grants Home Loans

The Department of Veterans' Affairs granted farm and home loans to 654 veterans in March in the amount of \$11,219,200, H.C. Saalfeld, director, reported today.

This compares with 832 loans in February for \$14,269,150, and 681 loans a year ago March for \$11,489,650.

Saalfeld said that for the first quarter of this year 1,754 veterans borrowed \$30,254,200, against 1,808 for \$29,563,200 a year ago. Except for a shortage of funds in the first half of the quarter just ended, he said this year's first-quarter figures would have been considerably higher.

The veterans' department received 778 loan applications last month, compared with 652 in February and 878 in March a year ago.

For the first quarter of this year 1,910 veterans applied for loans compared with 2,293 in 1970.
