Under the new policy, which was ordered by the State Department of General Services, only full-time state employees will be allowed to use state vehicles. Use will be strictly limited to official state business.

Smith said the new policy, which was developed at the direction of the governor would require that use of a state vehicle by anyone other than a full-time state employee must be recommended in writing and justified by the head of the agency involved.

Smith said this places the responsibility for any exception to the rule squarely on the top official of the agency and requires complete justification of the decision.

The change in policy was a direct result of the use of four state cars from the University of Oregon in a parade in Nyssa in February during the Poor People's Conference.

The governor's investigation disclosed that one of the cars was wrecked, and that the others were returned to the university in a very dirty condition. One of the cars was returned nearly a day late, Smith said.

He said the students apparently misrepresented to the university the reasons for use of the cars.

Smith, who represents Malheur and Harney counties, said the incident "clearly demonstrates the forceful role which citizens can play in seeking a positive change in government policies."

Without citizen interest, Smith said, "this matter would not have been called to the attention of those responsible for these policies."

Smith, who asked Gov. Tom McCall to investigate the incident from Nyssa area residents, said that students will no longer be allowed to use state vehicles.
