10 YEARS AGO

A picture recently found was identified by Audrey Ward as the first graduating class of 1911. Graduates were Kendrick Blodgett, deceased; Florence McDonald Belnap, Lewiston; Eva Boydell, Nyssa; and Bruce Duncan, deceased.

The photo was found by Mrs. Ralph Lawrence as she was going through some old records in the Nyssa Insurance Agency office. The business at 105 Main street was formerly owned by Miss Boydell's father, Josiah Boydell and was operated as Nyssa Realty Company. It was later sold to Don M. Graham, who in turn sold the business to his son-in-law and daughter, the Lawrences.

The picture was presented by Lawrence to the school at annual award night held May 23. It was accepted by Don Arai, student body president-elect.

Mrs. Belnap was valedictorian and Miss Boydell was salutatorian of the class. A three-story building housed the entire grade and high schools with classrooms on the first two floors and the upper story used for science classes. The old three-story structure was destroyed by fire in 1934 when a new building was erected and with later additions is now the present grade school building.
