Golden Eagle
Passports Used
At BLM Sites

Three recreation sites administered by the Bureau of Land Management in Idaho will operate under the Golden Eagle program this year, according to Richard Geier, Recreation Specialist for the BLM.

Geier said that the Cove Recreation Area on the Bruneau arm of C.J. Strike Reservoir south of Mountain Home, the Steck Recreation Site on Brownlee Reservoir near Cambridge, and the Mackay Recreation Area on the north shore of Mackay Reservoir, will be geared to accommodate the heavy tourist pressure that is anticipated throughout the State.

Golden Eagle Passports are available at the State and District Offices in Boise and other BLM offices in Burley, Idaho Falls, Salmon, Shoshone and Coeur d'Alene. The permit, which costs \$10.00, entitles the holder and all occupants of his vehicle to utilize BLM Golden Eagle sites as well as those designated by the Forest Service, National Park Service and Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife. The permits are good for calendar year 1971.

Geier explained that people who do not hold a Golden Eagle Passport can gain entrance to the three BLM sites by paying an entrance fee of \$1.00 a vehicle per visit. There are no additional charges on the recreation sites.

Hunters Advised
Of Big Game Rules

Big game hunters are advised that applications for unit deer and elk permits and controlled hunt tags for antelope, bighorn sheep, and cougar are now being accepted. Application forms are available at all license agencies.

Hunters filing for deer and elk permits must file on the application obtained with the purchase of the deer or elk tag. Those who apply for antelope, sheep, or cougar tags must file on the "controlled season" application form. Antelope hunters must also submit by check or money order the \$5 antelope tag fee. This fee will be returned to those hunters unsuccessful in the drawings. Tag fees for bighorn sheep and cougar should not be submitted but will be collected from successful hunters following the drawings.

Hunters desiring to file as a party not to exceed four persons for deer or two persons for elk or antelope must staple their applications together and mail in one envelope. Party applications exceeding the above number or those not fastened together will be entered individually. Only individual applications will be accepted for bighorn sheep and cougar. Hunters should remember that only one member of the party becomes the principal applicant and if his number wins, all members of the party are successful. Conversely, if his number is not successful, all members of the party also fail.

Applications must be in the Game Commission's Portland headquarters by 5 p.m. on the closing date to be included in the drawings. This means that up-state hunters should file well in advance to allow their applications to reach Portland by the closing time limit. All drawings will be held at 10 a.m. on the scheduled drawing date.

Closing and drawing dates are as follows:
Antelope, bighorn sheep, and August deer permits -- closing date, July 13, drawing date, July 23.

October and November deer permits -- closing date, August 10, drawing date, August 20.

Elk permits and cougar tags -- closing date, August 24, drawing date, September 3.

Only resident hunters are eligible to apply for special tags and permits.

Special Big Game Hunts

Although the big game regulations booklet will not be available for distribution to hunters for about three weeks yet, information on the fall hunts is available at all license agencies, the Game Commission advised today.

License agencies have been provided with a summary of all big game seasons this fall which includes hunting dates, bag limits, and a brief outline of hunting areas. Seasons included in the summary are those for deer, elk, antelope, bear, bighorn sheep, and cougar. A listing of archery seasons is included, as are unit permit seasons and extended or controlled seasons.

License dealers will also provide

vice hunters with information on filing procedures for all big game hunts on which tag or permit quotas are set. Hunting licenses and big game tags may also be obtained.

Youth Golf Classic

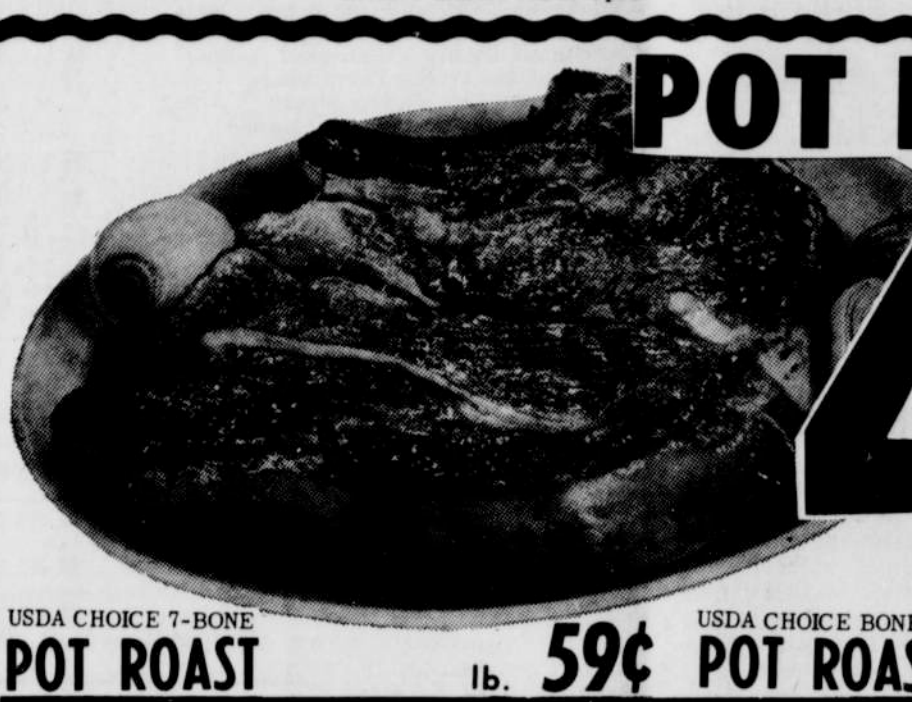
