### Rodriguez Children Celebrate Birthdays

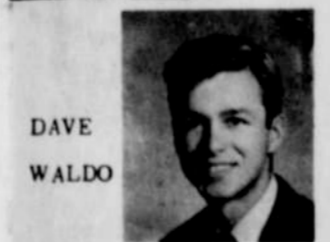
Jimmy and Scotty Rodriguez were guests of honor at a birthday party at their home Saturday July 10.
