Western Institute of Drug Problems at Portland State

Dr. Jerome H. Jaffe, President Nixon's newly-appointed special consultant on narcotics and dangerous drugs, will address the Fourth Annual Summer School of the Western Institute of Drug Problems, it was learned today. The Summer School is scheduled for the Portland State University campus on August 9-13.

Dr. Paul H. Blachly, Institute director, announced today that Dr. Jaffe will make two speaking appearances during the Institute program. He will discuss "Status of Drug Abuse Research" on Thursday morning, August 12. On Friday morning, August 13, he will share the platform with Attorney Neil Chayet of Boston to examine the topic, "What Should We Do Next About Drug Abuse?" Mr. Chayet will consider what should be done legally and politically and Dr. Jaffe will outline scientific and medical steps he feels should be taken.

Commenting on Dr. Jaffe's appearance at the Institute, Dr. Blachly said, "Arrangements were made with Dr. Jaffe several months ago -- long before his appointment by President Nixon. After his appointment was announced, we frankly had some fears that his new responsibilities would preclude his being with us. However, we now have received confirmation from Dr. Jaffe that he definitely plans to be here."

Dr. Jaffe's appointment by President Nixon was announced on June 17 as part of a "new all-out offensive" against drug abuse, which the President described as "America's public enemy Number One." In his new post, Dr. Jaffe heads a Special Action Office for Drug Abuse Prevention, aimed at coordinating all phases of the attack on the drug abuse problem except law enforcement. In addition to his consulting duties for the White House, Dr. Jaffe continues as director of the State of Illinois Mental Health Division's Drug Abuse Program.

He has gained nation-wide recognition for pioneering innovative techniques for treatment of heroin addiction, including comprehensive approaches in which methadone and therapeutic community approaches have been combined. He spoke at the second annual Institute in 1969, at which time he outlined the Illinois program in detail. Dr. Jaffe recently returned from a tour of Vietnam, where he went at the request of President Nixon to gather information on the extent of drug use by military personnel.

In his appearances at the Western Institute of Drug Problems, Dr. Jaffe will be addressing more than 400 professionals and laymen concerned with the drug problem. He is one of more than 20 nationally and internationally recognized professionals who will make presentations during the Summer School.

The Summer School and a two-day Marijuana Conference on August 7 and 8 are sponsored by the Mental Health Division, Alcohol and Drug Section, State of Oregon, in cooperation with the Division of Continuing Education, Oregon State System of Higher Education, and the University of Oregon Medical School.

Anyone interested in becoming better acquainted with the problems of drug abuse is invited to register for the two events. Participants may earn undergraduate, graduate or professional (non-college) credit by making arrangements in advance.

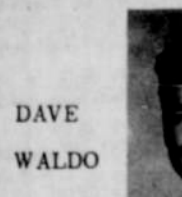
