

Governor Names Two To Dairy Commission

Earl Meier of Boring, president of the Oregon Dairymen's Association, and North Bend dairyman John Brelage Sr. have been appointed to the Oregon Dairy Products Commission by Gov. Tom McCall.

Brelage fills the post vacated by outgoing commission chairman Frank Rood of Coos Bay and Meier replaces Cecil Johnson of Grants Pass, vice chairman.

Meier and Brelage were sworn as new commission members at the July board meeting. Rood had been a member of the board since 1956 and had served as chairman since 1967. Johnson had been a board member since 1968.

Meier, 47, is a producer-

distributor and milks 250 cows on a 200-acre farm. He has been affiliated with the industry for 31 years. He is also the dairy industry representative from Multnomah County for the Oregon Farm Bureau Federation and is chairman of the Sandy Union High School board.

Brelage, 49, milks 130 cows on an 800-acre dairy. He currently is president of the Coos County Dairymen's Association. He is a member of the Oregon Grange, Oregon Farm Bureau Federation and Coos County Grange Supply Cooperative. He is a past member of the Coos County Soil and Water Conservation District.

Both men were appointed to three-year terms.
