Pheasant, Quail Seasons

The Oregon Game Commission advised hunters that beginning October 16 they will have almost a full slate of hunting seasons to choose from. The date marks the opening of the statewide pheasant and quail season to go along with the buck deer, chukar and Hungarian partridge, and waterfowl seasons already underway.

In Klamath, Lake and Harney counties upland bird hunters will start the season at one-half hour before sunrise. Following the 8 a.m., October 16 opening for the rest of the state, nimbros should adhere to the one-half hour before sunrise shooting time schedule. Shotgunners should check the timetable calendar in the upland game bird and waterfowl regulations booklet.

The season on pheasants will extend through November 14. The quail season in western Oregon will also close on that date but eastern Oregon gunners may continue after quail through January 23.

Bag limit for pheasants in western Oregon and Klamath County is 2 cock pheasants per day, 4 in possession. East

BASKETBALL RULES MEETING IN BAKER

Basketball rules changes for the 1971-72 season will be the subject of a meeting sponsored by the Oregon School Activities Association (OSAA) Tuesday night, October 26, at 7:30 at Baker High.

Caryle Staab, commissioner of the Baker Basketball Officials Association, said that John Hilsenteger, OSAA assistant executive secretary, will conduct the meeting for officials, coaches and interested fans.

The National Basketball Rules Committee of the United States and Canada has placed additional restrictions on a dribbler in his front court this season so that a five-second count will be applied anywhere in the front court if the dribbler is closely guarded. In the past this has applied only to the mid-court area.

Additionally, the free thrower must now remain in the upper half of the free throw circle after the ball becomes alive and until it touches the ring or backboard or until the free throw ends.

Two other changes made by the committee make it mandatory for the official score book to remain at the table throughout the game, including intermissions, and make it legal to utilize plastic nets of comparable dimensions to previously used cord nets on the baskets.

In addition to the discussion of rules changes, a movie entitled "Basketball by the Rules" will be shown. Staab has invited anyone interested in the game of basketball to attend the meeting, one of 14 being presented in different areas of the state.

side hunters (except Klamath County) have a bag limit of 3 in possession, while west roosters daily, 9 in possession. Eastern Oregon quail hunters have a bag limit in that part of possession.

Game biologists around the state predict only a fair season for pheasants but good for quail. The best pheasant hunting is expected in the Columbia

Basin, the Umatilla area, and in northern Malheur County. Quail hunting areas of eastern Oregon hunters are expected to do very well, especially in much of Lake, Harney, and Malheur counties, as well as other quail-producing areas of eastern Oregon. Some of the best mountain quail hunting will be found through much of southwestern Oregon.
